In Sam's Art class, everyone used Q-tips to create the illusion of color blending in their paintings. The students also learned about Pointillism and famous painters, such as George Seurat, founder of Neo-impressionism during the late 19th century. The tiny juxtaposed dots of multi-colored paint allow the viewer's eye to blend colors optically, rather than having the colors blended on the canvas.
